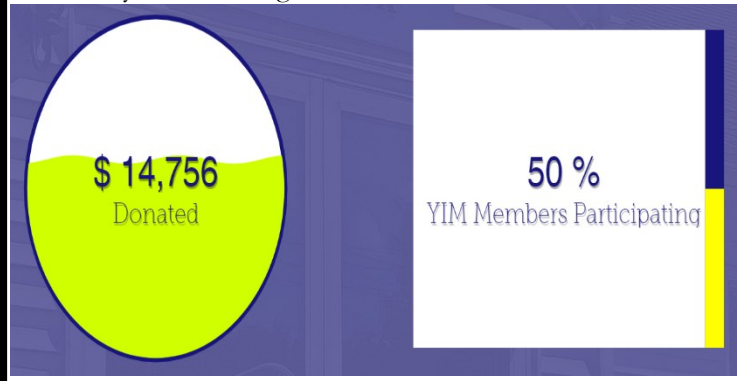

### Reminder – Museum Visit- Sunday, Oct 27 at 1PM

We are confirmed for a group visit to the Museum of Jewish Heritage – A Living Memorial to the Holocaust for a guided tour of the exhibition Auschwitz. Not long ago. Not far away. on 10/27/2019 at 1:00 PM. In this 90-minute tour, an expert Gallery Educator will lead a structured program covering the entire exhibition. Participants will discuss the history of Auschwitz as one of the most significant sites of the Holocaust both at its time of operation and within contemporary North American Holocaust education and memory. The exhibition includes more than 700 original objects and 400 photographs from institutions and museums around the world.
