Dr. David Pelcovitz holds the Gwendolyn and Joseph Straus Chair in Psychology and Jewish Education at the Azrieli Graduate School of Jewish Education and Administration of Yeshiva University. In addition, Dr. Pelcovitz is an instructor in pastoral counseling at the Rabbi Isaac Elchanan Theological Seminary.

Dr. Pelcovitz, who received his PhD from the University of Pennsylvania, has published and lectured extensively on a variety of topics related to education, parenting and child mental health. Areas of research and clinical specialty include family violence, the impact of domestic violence, stress management, transmitting values to children and adolescents and coping with trauma and loss.

Note from Jillian Daniels:

You may (or may not) remember that about a year ago I wrote to you about a 5K I was running to raise money for the school/organization that I work for. Well, I'm doing it again!

I recently started my second year working at The Children's Learning Center at CP Nassau. We provide school based services for children from 18 months through 21 years. Many of the children I work with are wheelchair bound and work so hard day after day to stand or take their first steps.

This year we are raising money for 2 very important programs that support our students. The first is Augmentative Communication for student who are unable to communicate verbally. These students use devices as basic as picture charts and as advanced as specially designed ipads to communicate their wants and needs to caregivers and peers.

The second program is our M.O.V.E. program. This program helps our children to get up and out of their wheelchairs and into various state-of-the-art equipment to support them physically so that they can learn better academically and have more opportunities to MOVE in their environment. To provide our students with the proper opportunities, we need the appropriate equipment.

Money raised in this fundraising campaign will go to these 2 programs and I invite you to help me support our students. With each of these programs, we see the children making progress on a daily basis!
